



Egypt, Issue of 1867

Mailed at Ismailia, Egypt, on the Suez Canal, 24 November 1871, by a French hydraulic engineer, and written to a woman living in Sebenico, Austria, on the Dalmatian coast. Carried by an Austrian Lloyd vessel from Alexandria to Trieste, and then down the Dalmatian coast to Zara and Sebenico. By the terms of the Austro-Egyptian Postal Convention of 23 July 1868, the rate for a single weight letter to an address in the Austro-Hungarian Empire was 2 1/2 piastres. 20 para = 1/2 piastre, plus two 1 piastre stamps = 2 1/2 piastres, so this letter was considered fully prepaid and marked "Franca" (Paid).
